



FDB Møbler was born and Børge Mogensen appointed as Creative Manager. From the beginning of the 1940s, Børge Mogensen continued Kaare Klint's approach to furniture design based on the dimensions of people, objects and furniture.



1947

The first furniture was produced in Njalsgade in Copenhagen. In 1947 FDB bought Tarm Chairs and Furniture Factory. The factory employed 50 carpenters and produced 10,000 chairs in one year.



FURNITURE THAT MAKES ROOM FOR PEOPLE

Furniture ought to make room for people. That has been our philosophy since 1942, when FDB Møbler was founded, with architect Børge Mogensen heading up the studio. Many new designers have since entered the fold, but the fundamental principles remain the same: To create beautiful, functional and exceptionally crafted furniture that makes room for everyday living at home. And that can withstand everyday wear and tear to age gracefully with those who use it.

FDB Møbler is internationally known as a frontrunner of Danish design. It's a story of classic pieces to be passed down from generation to generation. In fact, every new piece of FDB Møbler is born as an heirloom. The values that FDB Møbler was founded upon continue to shape every piece of oak and beech. They are woven into the seats and are upheld in each design, both when our ever-popular classics are re-issued from our design archives, and when we launch brand new designs. Regardless of whether we are talking about iconic pieces from FDB Møbler's classic collections or new, innovative designs, the goal is the same: To have the veritable quality of life that was envisioned when the first pieces of furniture emerged from our studio in 1942.






Børge Mogensen

1914 - 1972

Børge Mogensen was head of FDB Møbler's creative studio from 1942-1950. His goal was to design beautiful, simple and functional furniture, with solid craftsmanship at a price that was accessible to most people. Not only did he establish the foundation and values that FDB Møbler stands for today, he was also one of the driving forces that made Danish design internationally renowned.









MAKE ROOM FOR A BIG BROTHER

Børge Mogensen's stool design from the 1940s is now also in production in counter height, identical to the original, but with longer legs. Sharply outlined, with beautiful lines free of superfluous embellishments, the stool is functional down to its smallest detail. Take, for example, the hole in the middle of the seat, designed with finesse to make the stool easy to pick up and move. Like the original version, the counter stool is constructed entirely in the Mogensen spirit, with a devotion to fine craftsmanship in solid oak or beech.



Stine Weigelt 1978 -

Stine Weigelt, an industrial designer who earned her degree in 2014, has, already at a young age, become part of the FDB Møbler family with the Anker chair. 

Rasmus Appel is a qualified industrial designer from the Royal Danish Academy, School of Architecture, and takes a keen interest in how the living and organic properties of wood are transformed into furniture in a contemporary context. Rasmus Appel grew up on Bornholm, and as an islander, he has an innate understanding of simplicity and the important things in life.

FIND YOUR PLACE IN THE SUN WITH TEGLGÅRD

The aesthetic and the practical meet in the Teglgaard outdoor chair. Designed by Salto & Sigsgaard, it's just the chair for coping with that unexpected summer shower: a single shake or a quick wipe with a cloth and it's ready for use again. Teglgaard's frame is made of brushed alloy steel, with the back and seat made of polyester cord. Comfortable, but robust and durable, this is a refined design for when you need to be prepared for whatever the weather brings, be it in the garden, on the patio or on the street.

Kasper Salto & Thomas Sigsgaard 1967- / 1966-

Kasper Salto and Thomas Sigsgaard have worked together under the name Salto & Sigsgaard since 2003, and in that time have won awards and been represented at leading exhibitions. One of their most notable tasks was designing a new conference chair and desks for the UN Trusteeship Council Chamber – which Finn Juhl originally furnished and designed furniture for in the early 1950s.

Kasper Salto (b. 1967) is a trained cabinetmaker and industrial designer. Thomas Sigsgaard (b. 1966) graduated from the Royal Danish Academy of Fine Arts, and had a long career behind him before establishing a studio with Kasper Salto in 2003.




MARK FDB MØBLER'S 80TH ANNIVERSARY WITH A DESIGN THAT DOESN'T GROW OLD

For 80 years, FDB Møbler has created classics that remain as fresh as if they had just stepped off the drawing board yesterday. Erik Ole Jørgensen's couches are no exception. Launched in the 1970s, they still rank among FDB Møbler's greatest examples of timeless design and superior craftsmanship. To celebrate FDB Møbler's 80th anniversary, as well as Jørgensen's special feeling for textiles and color, we are issuing an edition of his two- and three-person sofas in red with Danish "Urdstripe" fabric. Erik Ole Jørgensen's simple, functional furniture places him among the most revered furniture designers in Denmark. Originally an upholsterer, he later began designing furniture. This is why his pieces are as much about the quality, colours and hand of the textiles as they are in the form of the wood.

A MEANINGFUL CHANGE

Minimizing the climate impact of our furniture is top priority as we remain steadfast in our commitment to meaningful change. For example, everything we produce in wood is FSC® certified (FSC-C164841), made with sustainable wood. We take care of the forests we harvest from, never taking from nature without giving something back. We are also working intently to provide transparency about our products' environmental footprint. Using specific, detailed calculations for each item, we measure the CO2 equivalent impact of the entire production process, from acquisition of basic materials through manufacturing, shipping and even daily use and ultimate disposal years later. The specific climate footprint of every FDB Møbler product is thus clearly mapped out, and the insights we gain from that process help focus and prioritize our efforts to drive down emissions. And the customer benefits as well: We believe that having a sense of where your FDB Møbler furniture fits into the bigger environmental picture can only enrich your connection with it.

B145 shelf designed by Ejvind Johansson

B145 is a stylish shelf with numerous uses that harks back to the Danish golden age of design. The drawings of Ejvind Johansson's shelf surfaced in FDB Møbler's archives, and it transpired that the shelf was one of the first pieces of furniture the legendary designer drew as head of FDB Møbler's design studio. Today, the shelf has been put into production, and appears as a timeless yet contemporary piece of furniture in oak veneer with two brackets in either stainless steel or black-painted.
